CLLR WALTON REPORTS ON A YEAR AS YOUR LOCAL COUNCILLOR

Councillor Daniel Walton lives with his family in Sawley and works all year round for the local community. Daniel is part of your Councillor team who have delivered a freeze in council tax for the last 3 years, helping hard working families across Erewash.

Cllr Walton is available seven days a week, all year round to help with your enquiries. Speaking in Sawley, Daniel commented "Residents should always

contact me if they need help with local services. I serve as a Borough Councillor and a Parish Councillor so I really know what is going on locally.

Local amenities and parks, plus environment and leisure services are an important part of our community. My job is to always represent local views and solve problems if they arise. Housing matters are essential, and have a 100% success rate with resolving issues with Three Valleys Housing in Erewash."

A priority for Cllr Walton is supporting our local schools. Daniel is a governor for both schools in Sawley, a responsibility he enjoys. Speaking about his Governor role Cllr Walton said "Working to improve the education of our children is at the heart of our community

and I enjoy being part of the school environment where my daughter is learning so much."

Cllr Walton worked on a borough wide initiative, at the Erewash Jobs Fair, organised by Jessica Lee MP. Speaking at the event Daniel commented "The Jobs Fair has been busy all day with many commenting on the wide range of employment and skills training on offer. I'm really glad I have been able to help out at this important event."

In March Erewash Borough Council will be holding its annual spring clean blitz, where residents and councillors are encouraged to pick up litter, paint over graffiti and make Erewash a cleaner and safer place. Sawley Junior School will be taking part on Sawley Park and Cllr Daniel Walton will be joining them. Daniel Said: "I urge all residents to get involved to help make Sawley a cleaner and safer place. The Church have also been great in organising the switching on ceremony, I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone involved."

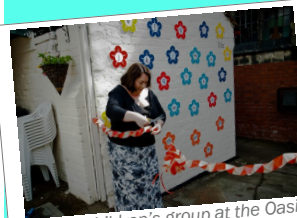

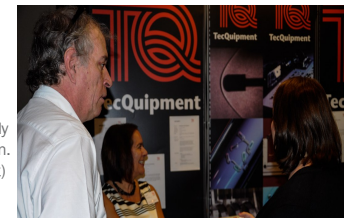
